Home School Agreement

North Crescent Primary School is a UNICEF Rights Respecting School.

UNICEF Article 5; parental guidance

- o Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents to guide and advise their child so that, as they grow, they learn to apply their rights properly.

UNICEF Article 18; parental responsibilities; state assistance

- o Both parents share responsibility for bringing up their child and should always consider what is best for the child. Governments must help parents by providing services to support them, especially if the child's parents work.

UNICEF Article 28; right to an education

- o Every child has a right to an education.

At North Crescent, we firmly believe that the partnership between Home and School is crucial to every child's social, emotional and academic development, achievement and well-being. The Home-School agreement is intended to provide a framework to enhance this partnership and set out expectations of each other in order to provide the best educational experience for every child.

As a School we will:

- safeguard every child's social, physical and mental well-being.
- teach your child to develop a positive and respectful attitude towards one another, regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, values, age or need.
- encourage your child to develop their voice and become an active member within our community, and help them recognise the impact they can have on the wider world.
- encourage calculated risks, present challenge, learn from our mistakes and set high expectations.
- encourage pupils to value their education and develop positive behaviours for learning.
- teach your child to respect their environment and our wider planet.
- lead quality teaching and learning to meet the needs of each individual.
- celebrate effort through a positive reward system...
- inform parents/carers of general school matters, including their child's progress.
- inform parents/carers of any concerns regarding their child's learning, progress or well-being
- provide homework, and parent workshops, to support your child's home learning
- encourage parents to become involved in the life of the school.

As Parents/Carers, I/We will:

- make sure that my child attends school regularly and is on time.
- bring my child to school ready to learn; having had breakfast and enough sleep
- let the school know if my child has any worries or concerns and encourage them to 'tell.'
- contact the school on the first day of absence, if they are unable to attend.
- see that my child wears the correct school uniform and that it is named
- work with the school to ensure my child follows school expectations and policies
- support my child with home learning, including reading, and encourage them to develop a positive attitude to our diverse, multi-cultural society.
- encourage a positive attitude towards education and our school.
- attend Parents' Partnership meetings and discussions about my child's progress.
- uphold the school policies and seek to resolve any concerns privately and courteously with the school.

As a Pupil at North Crescent Primary, I shall try to:

- Aim to be the best that I can be, and do the best that I can do, and take pride in all that I am and do.
- Take responsibility for looking after my school uniform.
- Behave well. Be polite, helpful and respectful to others, including their property.
- Take care of the school environment and school equipment.
- Ask for help if I need it.
- Tell an adult in school if I am unhappy or worried.
